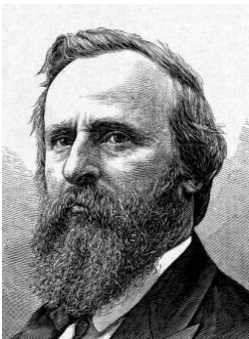
### I. President Grant

- U.S. Grant is elected in 1868.
- Grant will serve two terms(8 years till 1876) and was a very popular president.
- However, Grant's advisors were very corrupt.

### I. The Election of 1876

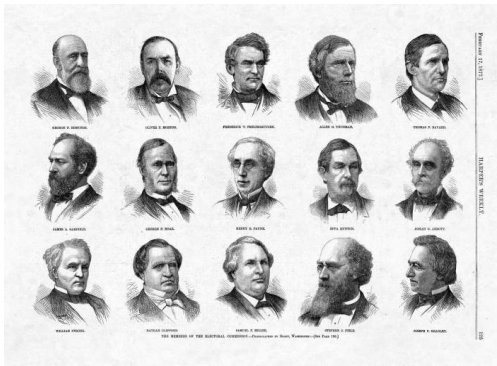
- Rutherford B. Hayes (R)

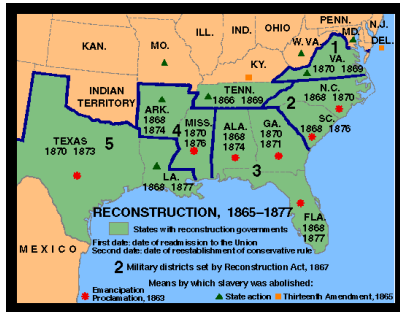


### III. The Compromise of 1877

- **Northern Republicans** want the **presidency**.
- **Southern Democrats** want the troops out of the **South**.
- **Hayes** is given the **presidency** if he takes the troops out of the **South**.



- The following map portrays the Reconstruction military redistricting of the south which came to an end with the Compromise of 1877



## SEGREGATION AND DISCRIMINATION



- By the turn of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, Southern States had adopted a broad system of legal discrimination
- Blacks had to deal with voting restrictions, Jim Crow laws, Supreme Court set-backs, and physical violence

## VIOLENCE

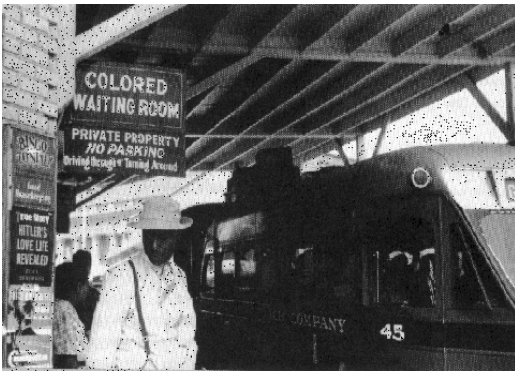


- African Americans who did not follow the racial etiquette could face severe punishment or death
- Between 1882-1892, more than 1,400 black men and women were shot, burned, or lynched
- Lynching peaked in the 1880s and 90s but continued well into the 20<sup>th</sup> century
